4. PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The fellowship is structured to facilitate learning and skill development across the following subject areas:

- CONDUCTING PEDAGOGY;
- ORCHESTRAL KNOWLEDGE AND LEADERSHIP;
- ARTISTIC AND COMMERCIAL PLANNING;
- ORCHESTRAL OPERATIONS.

This is a practical, experientially driven fellowship, which will involve:

- Shadowing selected Conductors for MSO rehearsals, performances and/or recordings;
- Assisting Chief Conductor, Jaime Martín, Principal Conductor, Benjamin Northey, and visiting conductors, where required and possible (including acting as understudy/providing cover as needed);
- Participation in mentoring sessions with selected conductors to receive feedback and skill development advice;
- Leadership development and career planning with the CEO;
- Conducting off-stage musicians when required;
- Conducting selected education, family and regional performances, as well as small ensembles for other artistic projects and sponsor/donor events as required;
- Working with section principals to gain an understanding of the leadership, artistic and operational aspects of their roles within the Orchestra;
- Opportunities with each MSO administration area to develop a holistic understanding and awareness of core business operations and the way in which each contributes to the overall success of a professional Symphony Orchestra.

- Responsive to, and proactively seeks, feedback to inform growth and development;
- Highly organised, with an ability to balance competing priorities;
- Maturity, flexibility, emotional intelligence and resilience.
